About Seacourt Print Workshop:

Seacourt Print Workshop is a creative hub in Bangor, North Down providing a unique space for engaging in creativity whatever your training or life circumstances. Our workshop is a place where people can come to make art, develop their skills and talents and connect with others.

We operate an open access printmaking studio and our printmaking family includes master printmakers, multidisciplinary artists, visiting artists, amateurs who experiment with art making, children and young people exploring creativity, those with mental health and disability who print to improve their well-being and people who love printmaking.

The Role Purpose:

To assist with the smooth and efficient running of Seacourt Print Workshop (SPW) for our outreach and community projects, members and other users and providing a high standard of service by maintaining the facilities, providing inductions, training and support services, monitoring, maintaining and recording stock & usage.

Hours of work:

We want to compile a list of freelance technicians who can be called upon from time to time based on specific needs and demands.

Hourly Rate for the role:

The hourly rate is £12.50 per hour and we will offer 7 hour shifts as and when needed.

Main Duties:

- Maintaining workshop equipment and facilities in a clean condition and in good working order
- Demonstrating technical processes including mixing ink and use of tools and presses when required
- Mixing and changing etch solutions for zinc and copper plates and water tray
- Maintaining records of material use, monitoring and reordering stocks
- Providing training to small groups and individuals in the use of equipment
- Supervising and assisting workshop users as required
- Actively promoting the services available at Seacourt to visitors and existing users

- Working within Seacourt's policies at all times and contributing to the implementation of Seacourt's strategic vision, aims and objectives
- Performing other duties as assigned by the Director

RELEVANT EXPERIENCE:

1. A third level qualification in fine art printmaking (or equivalent) with demonstrable experience of a broad range of techniques OR Five years practice as a Visual Artist specialising in printmaking
2. Two years-experience in a technician role within a printmaking studio
