


We matter to our locality, to the global communities we connect with, and the many diverse groups and individuals we engage with.

Job Purpose:

To be responsible for fundraising and business development to ensure that The Playhouse continues to be financially sustainable in order to meet the needs of the people and communities we serve.

Summary of Key Duties and Responsibilities:

Strategy, Leadership and Senior Management

- Work with CEO and Board of Trustees to develop and implement a robust and realistic fundraising and income generation strategy within The Playhouse's wider Strategic Framework to achieve agreed outcomes.
- Implement and oversee team systems, processes and administration to enable effective fundraising and stewardship whilst fully complying with applicable law and good practice.
- Provide leadership for the Front of House / Development Officer as well as hold responsibility for building and managing a fundraising and business development team as income generation develops.
- As a key member of The Playhouse Senior Management Team work closely with the CEO, Finance Manager, Head of Engagement and Theatre Producer / Director to sustain the work of The Playhouse and the benefits it brings. This means contributing to the common finance, marketing, idea development and the staff & building wellbeing activities of The Playhouse. You will also enable the success of The Playhouse through effective and inspiring leadership ensuring good communication and team working across the organisation.

Relationship Management

- Develop strong relationships with internal and external stakeholders to understand the work of The Playhouse and translate this into appropriate and agreed proposals, asks and campaigns.
- Nurture existing relationships with supporters whilst actively expanding both the number and range of new supporter opportunities across priority areas of income streams.
- Develop and implement a process for donor/supporter journeys to enhance the experience of giving to The Playhouse and grow long term relationships.
- Act as an ambassador for the The Playhouse, raising awareness of the importance of our work and network amongst the communities we serve and connect to.

Fundraising and Income Generation

- Manage and uplift existing sources of fundraising from the following:
 - Arts Councils
 - Central and local government
 - Trusts and foundations
 - Research Councils
 - Individual giving, including from high net worth individuals and utilising digital/online tools
 - Corporate fundraising and partnerships
- Engage whole staff cohort in contributing to fundraising through idea development, assisting bid writing and building relationships.
- Be responsible for completion of fundraising applications and reporting including paperwork, budgets & forecast, monitoring & evaluation
- To work with CEO, Senior Management Team and Front of House / Development Officer in relation to developing existing and new income streams from:
 - Tenancies and rooms hires
 - Conferences and events
 - Consultancy work
 - Educational programmes

- Maintain ethical and responsible processes and behaviours across the fundraising and income generating activity at all times and ensure all activities are safe and compliant
