Celebrating the Travelling Community's Connections with Irish Culture

8.00pm

The event will look at and celebrate the contribution that the Travelling community has made to traditional Irish music and at the connection that exists between Cant (language used by the Travelling community) and the Irish language.

This event is being organised by the Council in partnership with Áras Uí Chathail Access



Centre in the Natrional University of Ireland, Galway. The aim of the Access Centre is to encourage people from the Travelling community to take more advantage from formal education. Lack of formal education is seen as one of main reasons why the Travelling community experiences a high rate of social problems.

The event will begin with short talks by Oein De Bhairduin, from the travelling community, and Professor Dónall Ó Baoill on the Cant language and the link between Cant and Irish. This will be followed by an open discussion on this topic.

The rest of the event will feature music, stories and songs associated with the Travelling community. This will include singing in Cant, piping music and traditional music tunes, that relate to the travelling tradition, from top class local musicians Shane McAleer (fiddle) and Peter McKenna (uileann pipes). This is a follow-on event to training that was made available by the Good Relations unit of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council to members of staff during which the link between native Irish language and culture and that of the travelling community come to light.
